



Dear Parents,

At Orientation on August 3, 2017, we announced to parents and students in attendance that Dacula High School will have the incredible opportunity to pilot two cyber days for Gwinnett County Public Schools. Gwinnett County approved our request because of the excellent eCLASS work that has already been done by the teachers and students at Dacula High School. This is the first time such a request has been granted in GCPS.

Dacula High School will use the eCLASS cyber days to allow teachers the time they need to accelerate their progress in building the transformed classroom while continuing to provide 180 days of instruction. Even more, this will be done while increasing support for our students and opportunities for intervention.

Below are some of the details about how the eCLASS cyber days will work:

- The pilot cyber days will be **September 20** and November 8.
- Every student will receive an eCLASS assignment for each of their 6 classes.
- Attendance in the building will be optional for all students, but assignment completion is mandatory.
- Students attending school will arrive between 10:00 and 10:15 am.
- Regular education buses will begin running high school routes at 9:30 a.m. after the middle school drop off and should arrive at the high school around 10:15 am.
- Students who have transportation will be able to check in and participate in any of the below mentioned activities after 10:00 am.
- Students attending school will have the opportunity to work on their eCLASS assignments, get extra help in any subject area, make up assignments, participate in enrichment, etc.
- Breakfast and lunch will be served at school for students who attend.
- Parents are highly encouraged to send any student who is failing classes to school to receive academic assistance.
- Special education buses will run at the normal times, and self-contained special education classes will continue on a normal schedule.
